Learning in the Nursery

Your child's learning takes place both indoors and outdoors with carefully planned activities developing their experiences through play.

Children are also involved in adult directed activities based on your child's interests covering all aspects of the **Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum**.

Children also learn through their own initiated activities when adults offer questions, ideas and additional resources to extend the children's thinking.

Curriculum

This term's topic: Follow the Rules

Personal Social Emotional Development- This half term we will be focusing on the children's transition into reception. We will be visiting the classrooms and we will meet the teachers and nursery nurses. We will be finding out about the rules, expectations and routines in the reception classes.

Communication & Language- This half term the children will be expanding their vocabulary which is related to the core books and topics. We will be encouraging children to talk in full and complex sentences.

Physical Development- This half term the children will continue to refine their fine motor skills, including their pencil control to form letters and numbers.

Literacy- The children are continuing to learn new letter sounds. We will also be working on the children's listening skills, such as oral blending and hearing sounds in words and listening games.

Maths- This half term the children will continue to focus on counting. We will also be posing simple problem solving activities such as sharing, addition and subtraction problems.

UW- The children will be participating in planting and caring for the strawberries and vegetables in our garden area.

EAD- The children will be using role-play and small world play to explore our topics. We will be using musical instruments to encourage and develop the children's listening skills.
