### Year 6 SATs Final Results

The government released the most up to date data for school performance not long before the Christmas break. I am immensely proud to say that our children performed brilliantly and we had our best attainment and progress results since the introduction of the new National Curriculum. The table below shows what percentage of children achieved the expected standard (Exs), the higher score or greater depth, in writing only, (HS/GD) and whether the progress measures were below, average or above average.
