Welcome back! We hope you have had a lovely break and the Nursery team would like to take this opportunity to wish all of our families a Happy New Year. This week, the children have settled well back into their classes and routines and we are looking forward to the exciting learning opportunities taking place this term.

As the weather is turning increasingly cold and wet, please provide your child with appropriate clothing. Remember that the children have access to outdoor learning throughout the year.

This half term, the children will be learning about topics based on Imagination and Make Believe. They will be answering the question, 'Where can our imagination take us?' The children will have the opportunity to participate in various activities related to this topic. The date for this will be confirmed later in the term.

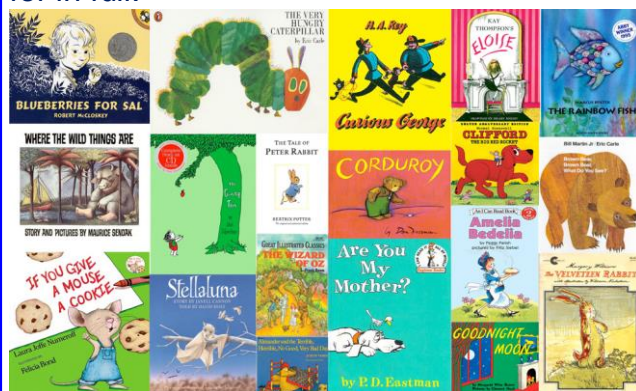
Library Days

Unfortunately, any child with a book still at home will not be able to borrow a new book. Lost or damaged books will need to be paid for in full.



Curriculum: This term's topics based on Imagination and Make Believe: Where can our imagination take us?

PSED - We will be talking about friendships and making good choices during play.

C&L - We are continuing to focus on speaking and listening and we will be encouraging the children to develop their questioning skills.

PD - This half term we will be focusing on developing gross and fine motor skills which will include the very important modelling of holding a pencil appropriately.

Literacy - We are continuing to build our knowledge of phonics. Knowing all the sounds of the letters in the alphabet is a key skill. We will also be exposing the children to many new stories, so that they develop a love of reading. We will be reading books such as: The Tiger Who Came to Tea, Zog, The Gingerbread Man and Room on the Broom.

Maths - Counting to 20, recognising 2D shapes and creating simple repeating patterns will be a key focus this half term. Please support this learning at home by asking your child to find numbers, shapes and patterns in the environment.

EAD - Many of our activities will involve the children in design and creative arts this half term.

UW - We will be looking at and talking about some of the things that the children have observed in their environment and shown an interest in, such as animals, natural materials and found objects. The children will be developing an understanding of different building materials and how they can be used.
