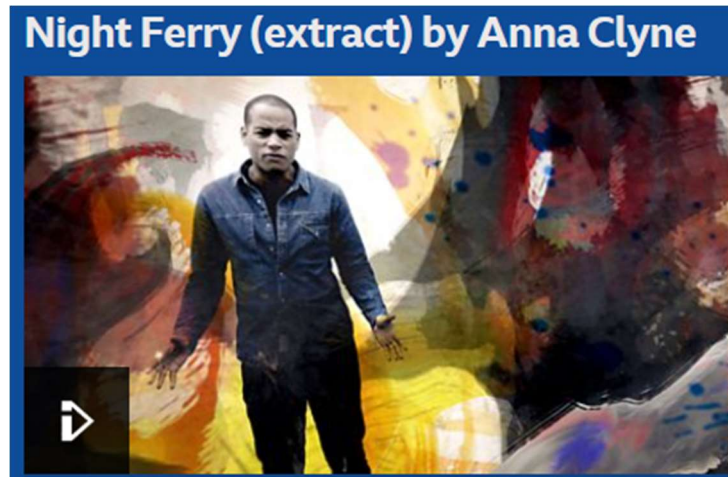


# Music: Year 5
