Carry Over Activities Sheet

<u> Language Enrichment Programme - Level 3</u>

This programme works on increasing children's vocabulary, ability to follow instructions, talk about 'first,' 'next' and 'last,' learn categories and answering 'why' questions. Here are a few activities that you can do to support their language development.

Activities

- © <u>It's Snack Time!</u>: When making a snack with your child (e.g. a drink or sandwich) give short instructions with gestures at each stage e.g. 'Get the <u>bread</u> and a <u>knife</u>, take the <u>cheese</u> and the <u>butter</u> from the <u>fridge</u> etc.'
- © <u>First, next and last:</u> When your child is carrying out everyday activities (e.g. getting dressed, washing their hands) talk about each step as it happens;
 - e.g. first turn on the tap, next wash your hands, last dry them

Take turns with your child to describe first, next and last.

- Simon Says: Play this game using position words like in, on, under, in front of, behind, next to.
 - e.g. 'Simon says... put your hands on your head / put your foot in the bag / lie
 - under the table / hide behind the door / stand in front of the TV/ put the apple

next to the book.



- © <u>Categories</u>: Play this game together using familiar categories e.g. rooms of the house, animals, places. One of you picks the category and you take turns with your child naming something in that category e.g. Animals: 'dog' 'cat' 'cow' 'pig'. The person who can name the most items in a category is the winner!
- © <u>Story questions</u>: Read a story and ask prediction questions e.g. 'What do you think will happen next?' before turning the page in the book and finding out what happens.
