The government guidance, sent to schools yesterday, states that they expect all staff and pupils back at school, albeit with a strong focus on health and safety.

Thank you to all parents and children who have logged in to the weekly Zoom meetings. Brampton Primary School has always been committed to maintaining excellent home-school links with our community and, sadly, in recent times, this has been challenging for most schools. We hope that the weekly Zoom meetings go some way towards reconnecting with children who are currently at home.

We provide a weekly opportunity for children to chat with their class teacher and have recently introduced club sessions, which we hope your children are able to attend. We have been listening to feedback from children and parents regarding the Zoom meetings and, in a few cases, we understand that the meetings can become overcrowded and children do not always get a chance to speak with their teachers. In response to this, the teachers will review their meeting arrangements this week and, where required, reduce group sizes so that all children are able to be heard and take a more active role in those sessions.

In the final week of the summer term (week beginning 13th July), we will be hosting Zoom meetings, for children to meet their new class teachers. We are currently upgrading our online platform to Microsoft 365 to better support home learning in the future. Over the next two weeks, our staff will be receiving training on the new program in readiness for September 2020. It has significantly more features than myUSO and will provide a more user-friendly system for staff and children to use when setting and supporting children who are learning at home.
