



# News – Lower Phase Year 2

Year 2 began this half term with an inspiration day centred on our topic *Do you like to be by the seaside?* In preparation for our travels, we created and decorated passports using ideas from our research and imaginations. The children then dreamt of and described their perfect holiday abroad and wrote postcards to their friends or teachers describing all the amazing adventures they had enjoyed. The children enjoyed learning about the physical features of coastal areas and observing how the features of the seaside has changed over the years. Below are two of the postcards that children in Poland class created.



In English, the children have been writing letters that are both formal and informal. After exploring the features of a letter, the children were tasked with writing a letter to explain why they were not able to come to school on a particular day. One of our favourite letters can be found below.



In mathematics, the children consolidated their fractions learning (that began during remote learning) and demonstrated a clear understanding of the concept. We were really impressed. We then moved on to learning to read time to the nearest five minutes, exploring the concept of reading the minutes by using the hour markers. This is something that can take time for children to grasp so please revisit this at home, often, by simply asking the children to tell you the time and asking them to explain how they did it.

In science, the children have been learning about what a plant needs in order to germinate. The children have learnt about methods of seed dispersal (animals are definitely their favourite method). The children conducted an experiment to see which conditions are most suitable for a seed to germinate. The investigation is ongoing but below are some of the seeds that children in Belgium class have started growing.


