### Teddy Bear's Picnic

On Thursday this week, our Nursery had a wonderful time in Brampton Park, taking part in a Teddy Bear's Picnic. It was wonderful to be able to take the children out of school, and their behaviour and enthusiasm were exceptional. ### Puberty Talks

This week, our Year 5 and Year 6 took part in the RSHE 'growing up' talks. Thank you to all of the parents who contributed to the consultations that led up to these sessions; your input was invaluable. The children were respectful and interested throughout. They were incredibly mature about the content and asked excellent follow-up questions.

### Fairy and Traditional Tales Competition

All children across the school have been reading and learning about fairy and traditional tales during their English lessons. Nursery read *The Enormous Turnip*, while Year 6 read and analysed *Blackberry Blue*. The children completed a piece of writing, based on their own version of a fairy tale, and these are being entered into a whole-school creative writing competition. The writing produced across the school has been fantastically creative; a story written by a child in Y2, even brought a tear to Ms Baillie's eye! Our winners will be announced during the last week of term.

### Y6 Transition

As we approach the end of our Y6 pupils' primary school journey, we spend time reflecting on their next step in education. This involves a number of transition workshops in school, led by our Y6 teachers and our learning mentors. We also attended a workshop at the IntoUniversity centre in Burford Road. The main objectives of these workshop are to help students identify and practise the skills they will need when they transition into secondary school: how to meet new people, timetabling, organising their resources, how to develop new skills and thinking positively about the next step in their education.

### Maths Week London

This week all pupils from Nursery to Year 6 have been participating in a range of mathematics activities based around *Euro 2020*. Whether reading and interpreting tables highlighting the number of headers per game (Year 2), or working out the distance a player has run (Year 5), the children have risen to the challenges with aplomb. Entries for the *Maths Week London* project competition have already started to flood in and we are looking forward to judging them – make sure your child submits theirs in by **Monday 5<sup>th</sup> July**.

The *TTRS* and *Numbots* competitions have also been a roaring success, with one child managing **141 correct answers in 1 minute**. The winners from each year group will be announced next week.

## News from - EYFS Nursery



In nursery this term, the children have been learning about *Traditional Tales, Fairy Tales and Following the Rules*. The children have learnt about different stories such as, *The Enormous Turnip, Little Red Hen, Katie in London* and this week we have been reading, *Baggy Brown and the Royal Baby*. Our nursery classes had their Teddy Bears' Picnic on Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> July 2021 in Brampton Park to celebrate this topic. The children had the opportunity to make sandwiches, fruit kebabs and fruit salad which they enjoyed eating during the picnic. The children were so excited to bring in their own teddy bears from home. We hope that all of the children had an amazing time.

The nursery children have been discussing what we can do to help our bodies stay healthy such as exercise, eat healthily (they discussed fruits, vegetables, meat, eggs and milk), sleep, brush our teeth, take baths and wash our hands often. They were asked questions such as, "What types of food help to keep us healthy; should we eat a lot of sweet foods and snacks?" and "What is your favourite food?" The children were able to sort a range of foods and show a healthy plate of food.

This week we have been celebrating Maths Week. The nursery children took part in a range of activities that developed their mathematical concept of number, shape and reasoning towards maths. These included constructing and building using 3D shapes, inside and outside of the classroom, matching dominoes and weighing and measuring objects to recognise which is heavier and which is lighter. As well as this, they became familiar with the clock face to enable them to understand routines and timetables such as when breakfast, lunch and home time is. The children also used counters to make alternating patterns. The children were given opportunities to investigate how the Numicon fit into each other and began to recognise odd and even numbers.



The nursery children have been very busy rehearsing their graduation songs. The *Nursery Graduation 2021* will be recorded on Thursday and then uploaded onto Microsoft Teams for all of the parent and carers to watch, once the videos have been edited.
