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


Dear Parents, Carers and Children,

It has been a busy end to another interesting year. Last week we held our achievement assemblies and, as we could not have parents in school to cheer their children on, we filmed the awards and put them up on Teams for you to enjoy at home.

September Arrangements

News from Upper Phase Year 6

The last two years have certainly presented many challenges for our Year 6 pupils, and it is hard to believe that soon they will be in Year 7. We would like to say well done for showing great resilience and persevering through a difficult year. Covid has caused us to change many things about school, but the children adapted well to these changes and remained positive.

As well as studying the conventions of fairy tales in English, the children have been considering the many changes that they will be experiencing in the coming years. This has provided them with the opportunity to reflect on their time at primary school, and in particular, their best memories from Brampton. Year 6 pupils have used these reflections in their own non-chronological report about their time at Brampton Primary School. For the Year 6 teachers, it has been wonderful to read about their favourite trips and the teachers they have really enjoyed working with.

In mathematics, the Year 6 pupils have been reviewing some of the key topics covered this year, including converting units of measurement, ratio, long division and angles. Your child could continue to practise mathematics questions by accessing SATs past papers online. This would enable them to put their end-of-year knowledge to the test by tackling some tricky problem-solving questions.

During the last month, the children participated in class workshops about transitioning to secondary school, delivered by class teachers and learning mentors. They also attended a workshop about secondary school at IntoUniversity. We were all very impressed by their mature behaviour in these sessions and lots of sensible questions were asked by pupils.

Alongside taking a well-deserved break, we also encourage all of Year 6 to continue to practise their times tables and to read regularly throughout the holidays. This will help many children feel a bit more prepared for starting secondary school English and maths lessons. There are several online resources for children which can be accessed during the holidays, such as BBC Bitesize, Once Upon a Picture and The Literacy Shed.

Looking towards the future, we encourage all of our Year 6 children to ensure that they continue to prioritise their health and wellbeing. They should employ the strategies that we have discussed during our Thoughtful Thursday sessions and remember that they should speak to a trusted adult if they need help with anything.

The Year 6 team have had a fantastic year with this year group, and we wish them all the best for secondary school.
