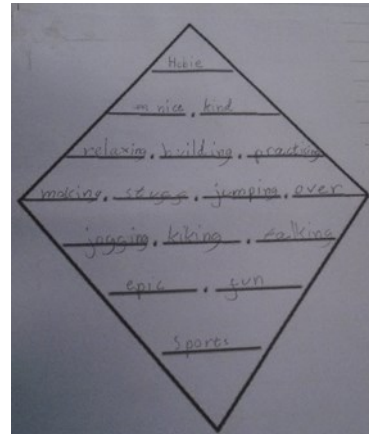
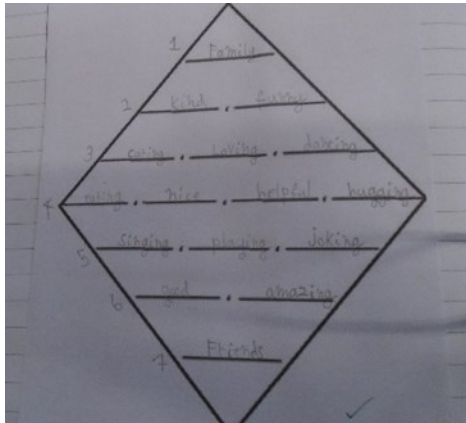
Last weekend, the clocks went forward by one hour.

News from lower phase - Year 2

There comes a time in a child's life when one must take time to reflect on their experiences and their surroundings. In Year 2 this is what we have been doing, as we have delved into the magical world of poetry. We have explored different types of poems such as diamante poems and free verse poems. We analysed special moments in our lives and then wrote about them in the form of a poem.



As we progress through life, time is one constant that every human thinks about in their daily life. Year 2 have really embraced the challenge of telling the time and in particular identifying what each numeral on the clock stands for.

In Science we have been entering into the extraordinary world of plants. Beautiful, tall stems have emerged from seeds as we learnt that not all plants need soil to grow.
