
At the start of May, the Muslim members of our community will celebrate the end of Ramadan and take part in Eid celebrations.

News from lower phase —Year 1

In English, the children in Year 1 are focusing on stories and texts that involve travel and explorers. This links to our whole school's summer term topic: *Travelling and Explorers*. The children were on the edge of their seat whilst listening to the story of *Beegu* by author Alexis Deacon. The story is all about a foreign, cute alien who crash-landed on Earth! The children loved the opportunity to role-play how the character, Beegu, was feeling and thinking on Earth. They worked hard on their describing skills and to build an adjective wordbank to help them form interesting sentences independently. The children were also in for a shock when they found Beegu's space-ship alongside some rocks and sand in the playground. This allowed the children to really explore different language and vocabulary in their descriptions of Beegu's planet.











In maths this week, the children in Year 1 focused on building their number skills to 100. They strengthened their knowledge in recognising and counting 10s through songs, number charts and visuals. They worked with their learning partners to recognise place values and were able to make 2-digit numbers using their dienes and on their whiteboards. The children enjoyed comparing numbers, they learnt to find and give reasons and explanations for their answers on which number was more and which number was less.



In science this term, the children in Year 1 are learning about animals including humans. They started their science lessons looking at invertebrates; cold-blooded animals with no backbone! The children found looking at common invertebrates, such as snails, very enjoyable especially learning about the different body parts, the movements of the invertebrates and how they live. They are definitely not put off by the oozing slime or tentacles!
