This week there has been a real sense of excitement across the Early Years. June 2nd - 5th 2022 marks the Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations. To learn about this historic occasion, our nursery children have been enjoying many Jubilee activities throughout the week.

We started the week by baking and decorating crown biscuits. The children enjoyed stirring, kneading and using their senses- smelling, touching flour and even tasting some of the ingredients before putting them into the mixing bowl. Our little bakers were very proud of what they'd made and enjoyed eating their biscuits during the Tea Party.





Developing fine motor skills is an important part of our children's learning in the Early Years.
