


Dear Parents and Carers,


This Sunday is Fathers' Day. Spend some time discussing fathers and the people in our lives who are like a father to us.

# News from upper phase — Year 6

The SATs have now been and gone. All the hard work and effort from the children, parents and staff resulted in a successfully run SATs week. Despite the end of SATs, our year 6 children have continued their enthusiastic approach to learning. Over the last two weeks, we have focused on developing independent writing skills. The children will be writing a wide variety of fiction and non-fiction pieces this term, including commentaries, diary entries, letters and fact files.



Reading is an excellent resource for writing and the children have already engaged with books and other extracts to inspire creative thinking. Across the school this term, children will be delving into inference, a key skill for any book-lover, with children using this knowledge to express thoughts and opinions in more subtle way. You could do some shared writing with your child at home, asking them to check their grammar, spelling and punctuation using the fantastic resources in their reading record.

In mathematics, we will start by revising some of the key topics so that the children are prepared for their life in secondary school. Once we have covered this, we will be cracking codes, solving crimes and creating artistic masterpieces. The children will look at Ancient Greek mathematics, and will be solving fiercely complex murder mysteries through the medium of codes. In the final part of the term, we will be creating mathematical art inspired by Escher and Celtic knot-work. It will involve tessellations and the mesmerising whirls of curves of pursuit.





This term for science, the children will be doing an in-depth study of the Titanic, specifically how scientist and engineers were able to make the ship float and cross vast amounts of sea. They will be asked to look at a variety of forces that helped the Titanic manoeuvre across the ocean whilst also discussing the reason why it sunk. By the end of the term, the children should be able to use live models to demonstrate how the sinking of the Titanic could have been prevented.

The year 6 team and children raised exactly £1999 towards their trip to Chessington World of Adventures. On behalf of all the staff and children involved in fundraising, we would like to say a massive thank you to everyone who supported the event: making food, donating toys or purchasing items over the two days. We cannot help but wonder just how much candy floss the children at Brampton Primary School consumed... It really was a great success and the children loved the build-up and managing the event: we definitely have some future market traders and entrepreneurs in our current cohort. The children were incredibly excited about the trip and it turned out to be a great day out for everyone. Once again, thank you for your support.



Last week the year 6 team also led a trip to the World War 1 battlefields in France. While there, we visited the Thiepval and Vimy Ridge memorials (the latter is pictured below). The children were provided with an in-depth account of what took place during one of the deadliest battles in British history, while also doing their school proud by asking some questions that even managed to flummox our guides. Again, thank you to all the staff, children and parents involved.
