Dear Parents / Carers,

Welcome back. We hope that you have had a wonderful break over the half term holiday. We are immensely pleased that the children have returned keen, and eager to learn, and we aim to keep this momentum going throughout this summer term. We are very excited about the learning that is going to be taking place across the curriculum this half term. The whole school is focusing on the topic *Follow the Rules*. In Year 2, we are going to be making comparisons between Richmond Park and Chobe National Park in Botswana, exploring the question: What rules do you have to follow to stay safe in the park?

The geography home learning should be completed throughout the half term. Just a reminder that the project can be based around anything the children wish. It could be a poster, picture, model or a piece of writing based on their geography project.

Summer Reading Challenge:

The children will be visiting the library over the next couple of weeks to start the summer reading challenge. This is a great way to motivate the children and help them to maintain an interest in reading over the summer holidays. Each child will collect prizes and stickers for books they read. If your child completes the challenge, by reading six books or more over the summer, they will receive a special certificate in a school assembly in the autumn term.

At the end of Year 2, the four classes will be mixed up, taking in to account friendships groups, attainment, attitudes to learning and also to give children new opportunities to learn alongside peers within their year groups.
