

## Curriculum

#### **English:**

In English, the focus will be on sports and games, and non-fictional writing. Children will write the biography of a sports personality and non-chronological reports.

#### Maths:

The children will be exploring angles such as right angles, acute and obtuse. They will then move onto exploring different types of lines in addition to properties of shapes, both 2D and 3D. Finally, children will explore perimeter where they will be calculating perimeter by adding all of the lengths together.

#### **BPS Curriculum:**

What was it like when the Romans ruled Britain? is our focus this term. Within this topic, Year 3 will learn all about the Roman invasion, the battles with the Celts, the story of Queen Boudicca and how the Romans still impact our lives today

## **Science:**

Year 3 science will focus on plants and an in-depth study of flowers, fruits and seeds. The children will use their knowledge of the plant life-cycle to assess the impact of flowers, fruits and seeds on the growth of the habitats around the world. They will be conducting their own investigations to further develop their understanding.

#### **PSHE:**

We will look at the topic of *Changing Me* as the children prepare to move into a new school year. The book *My New Baby* by Anne Kubler will be read to support their study of families.

#### RE:

What do Sikhi sayings tell us about Sikhi beliefs? In this unit children will be investigating Sikh symbols and sayings, applying how Sikh and English sayings impact people's lives today and will link similar teachings from different religions.

<u>Art and design:</u> Children will be exploring Ancient Egyptian art. Children will move onto designing and making their own scrolls.
