

Curriculum

This term's topics:

English:

Our topic this half term in English is *Follow The Rules*. The children will be looking at different sports and sportsmen and women and will be writing non-fiction texts such as biographies. They will also look at audience and purpose for texts and will be creating their own newspaper article based on BPS Sports Day.

Maths:

This term we will be revising some of the topics we taught over the year. This is to provide the children with another opportunity to strengthen their understanding. We will focus on addition, subtraction, multiplication, division and fractions. Alongside this, the children will continue to develop their understanding of number and written methods as part of their learning in arithmetic.

BPS Curriculum:

This term we will be learning about the differences between the Spartans and Athenians in Ancient Greece. We will also be learning about some significant events from this period and will consider the lasting impact this civilisation has had on our world today.

Science:

This term in science, the children will be learning about some of the changes animals and humans experience as they grow up. The children will explore the life cycles of mammals and birds and compare it to the human life cycle.

Religious Education:

This term in RE, pupils will be exploring how Christians try to follow the example of Jesus. We will consider what a Christian might learn from the stories about Jesus with a focus on what Jesus taught about giving. Alongside this, we will be summarising how Jesus set an example for Christians and the key principles underlying the way of life many people of this religion adopt.

PSHE:

Our topic in this half term is Changing Me. Children will explore the changes they experience as they grow up. They will discuss how to build their self-esteem and maintain a positive self-image.
