Home Learning and Reading Records:

We place a great deal of importance on reading. Research shows that children who read regularly, and enjoy reading, make better progress in their learning. As a result, they can expect to enjoy greater future success. Therefore, it is expected that all children read every evening for 20-30 minutes and record this in their reading record. To ensure we work together to improve your child's reading success, we would like to ask parents and carers to monitor their child's daily reading closely and ensure they record their reading in their reading record. Home Learning will also include Times Table RockStars and RWI spelling.

We believe that it is vital that children are given the opportunity to read aloud and also that they are read to. The importance of listening to your children read, helps them with understanding and their comprehension skills as well as working out what's printed on the page. Please use the following link: English Oxford Owl to support your child in English.

For families who would like more home learning, we suggest your child carries out further research about their curriculum topic. The big question that Year 3 are looking at this half term is: *Has our wonderful world always looked like this?* They will be learning about dinosaurs and volcanoes. Parents and carers can also ask their class teacher for reading comprehension practice papers, if desired. If you have any queries regarding home learning, please do not hesitate to discuss these with your child's class teacher after school or by arranging an appointment at a time that is more convenient.

To support the children in answering this question this half term, they will be taking part in an interactive workshop in school in the 'Dinosaur Dome'. The children will explore real fossils and learn what it means to be a palaeontologist and a dinosaur expert!

How do Jewish People celebrate their beliefs at home and in the synagogue?


Year 3 PE Days

Year 3 Autumn 1 Curriculum

English: We will be focusing on Black History Month, this will involve reading texts from a range of cultures and exploring a more diverse range of authors and main characters within the texts. The children will be exploring the texts 'Fly Eagle Fly' and 'Wangari's Trees of Peace.'

Maths: We will focus on number facts, numbers to 100 and then move onto addition and subtraction.

History: 'Has our wonderful world always looked like this?' The children will be exploring different types of dinosaurs and how volcanoes are formed.

Science: We will be exploring different rocks, fossil and soils and their properties.

Religious Education: How do Jewish people celebrate their beliefs at home and in the synagogue? The children will learn about how Jewish people celebrate the festivals of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur.

PSHE: Being Me in My World

Computing: Computing systems and networks and how computers connect to each other.

PE: Athletics

Spanish: Me and My World – My family

Art and Design: Drawing skills

Design and Technology: Electrical systems – electric poster

Music: Learning about sustainability through music.
