Dear Brampton Family,

Welcome to the second half of the autumn term. We cannot quite believe that we have already completed our first half term of this academic year. We hope you all had a well-deserved break over the half-term holiday – it was good to welcome the children back on Monday.

Rights Respecting School Award Assessment

We are very excited and extremely proud to announce that on Monday 16th October, we achieved our Rights Respecting School silver award following an accreditation assessment by Ms Helen Trivers from UNICEF.

UNICEF is the world's leading organisation working for children and their rights. The Rights Respecting Schools Award is granted to schools that show commitment to promoting and realising children's rights and encouraging adults, children, and young people to respect the rights of others in school. Silver is given to schools that make excellent progress towards embedding the principles of the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child into its ethos and curriculum.

Ms Trivers was very complimentary about the work that has been carried out in school to ensure the children understand the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child and what this means to them. The assessment process was very successful and she expressed a belief that it would not be long before we would be ready to apply for the gold award.

The children who spoke to the assessor were articulate, passionate and clear on what rights they understood and what this meant to them as 'global citizens'. It was evident that the leaders, staff and the children were committed to embedding the rights into everyday life at Brampton and that it is a part of the school ethos.

We are extremely proud of our achievement and believe it demonstrates our belief about the importance of putting children's rights at the heart of a school. The award recognises achievement in putting the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child at the heart of a school's planning, policies and practice. A Rights Respecting School is a community where children's rights are learned, taught, practised, respected, protected and promoted. We now plan to continue our RRSA journey by working toward the Gold Award.

This achievement could not have happened without great partnership working with our parents and carers. I would also like to thank Mr Khan and Mrs Hardie for all their hard work in ensuring we achieve this award. This is for all of us as one 'Brampton Family'.

After School Clubs

We are pleased to see that all the after school clubs offered before half term are nearly full. We will continue to endeavour to add more clubs to the offer as the term progresses. We will of course be reviewing the process of booking clubs, and the selection process, moving away from first come, first served method. Priority will always be given to Pupil Premium children. 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Learning Reviews

The meetings were very positive and the teachers were pleased to hear that parents and carers appreciated the work they do in supporting each child's learning. Literacy

In Reception, we endeavour to promote a love of learning, where interests and talents are nurtured and challenged, empathy is fostered and friendships are formed. Maths

This term in Reception, we have recognised representations of 1, 2 and 3 and continued to increase our thinking skills to find out ways that we can count. This can take place by touching each object as we count, pointing using our fingers, and counting in a line. We have also used our thinking skills to subitise a total amount up to 5 which means that we can look at a group of objects and realise how many there are without counting.

We were welcomed into the church to learn about why it is a special place of worship for Christians. To finish the session, we were asked to consider if we have similar or different places to worship or different activities of beliefs too.


All About Me



Online safety

Internet Safety and the use of Social Media

Brampton Primary School is committed to promoting the safe and responsible use of the Internet. We therefore feel it is our responsibility to raise particular issues and provide assistance to parents and carers. Many online applications used by children provide great opportunities to communicate and socialise with friends and family. Social media platforms can, however, present specific dangers to children. Parents, carers and schools have a responsibility to ensure children are kept safe online and must be aware of the potential risk certain applications pose.

Here are a few tips to help you monitor your child's Internet habits:

- It is advisable to show an interest in what you child is accessing via the Internet and to pay close attention to their behaviour while they are online. Try to get your child into the routine of allowing you to check the devices they are using for inappropriate content or potential cases of online bullying.
- Try to insist children, particularly those under 10, access devices and social media in a public room, such as the living room or kitchen. This will give you the opportunity to glance over every so often and step in and advise them if needed. We also strongly recommend a device free period before bedtime to allow for uninterrupted sleep and rest.
- Ensure you keep abreast of current trends by asking your child what applications they are using on and asking to see how these work. A quick Google search for 'popular apps used by kids' can be a great help, as well as reading the advice and guidance on websites like the NSPCC: Keeping children safe online | NSPCC. You can even set up your own account to experience how certain applications work.
- Many applications have a group chat facility. This means that all information is shared with anyone who is in the group. In these situation, privacy can be lost and in some cases strangers can be added to groups mistakenly.

What We Teach Children in School

During our online safety lessons and presentations, children are taught a range of strategies to keep themselves safe online. It is vital that parents, carers and the school are giving children the same messages, so we have listed some of the key points below:

- Avoid posting any personal information online
- Think carefully before posting pictures or videos of yourself. Once you have put a picture of yourself online, people can see it and may be able to download it: you do not control it anymore.
- Keep your privacy settings as high as possible.



- Never give out your passwords.
- Do not add or accept friend requests from people you do not know.
 - Do not meet up with people you have only met online.
- Remember that not everyone online is who they say they are.
- Think carefully about what you say before you post something online.
- Respect other people's views. Even if you do not agree with someone else's perspective, it does not give you licence to be rude or disrespectful.
- If you see something online that makes you feel uncomfortable, unsafe or worried, leave the website and tell a trusted adult immediately.

We understand that it is increasingly difficult to keep up with the new and ever changing technologies. Our children are immersed in a society that is dependent on powerful computers, including smart phones, tablets, interactive online games and virtual communities. It is our responsibility, however challenging it may be, to guide our children to use these devices correctly and responsibly.


