

Communication and Language



• The children will continue practising their speaking and listening skills. They will use talk to organise themselves and their play. They will also be focusing on **Why** questions.









Personal, Social, Emotional Development

This term we will be getting the children used to the idea of moving up to Reception. Becoming more independent will be a priority for us. We will learn about showing sensitivity to other peoples' needs and feelings and how to negotiate and solve problems with others.









Physical Development





This half term we will be focusing on dance – moving freely with pleasure and confidence in a range of ways. We will be learning to hold the pencil between our thumb and two fingers through lots of fine motor activities and mark-making practice.








Literacy









Children will be learning to describe main story settings, events and characters.

They will use some of their print and letter knowledge in their early writing.





We will use lots and lots of oral Fred Talk in Nursery. This is where we say words in sounds and encourage children to work out what is being said. For example, 'Can you get your c-oa-t (coat)?'. Fred the frog can only talk in sounds and they have to work out the words he is saying.

We will continue teaching RWI Set 1 sounds.









Maths

Our focus will be on number - children will continue counting forwards, and backwards accurately using the counting principles. They will learn to compare quantities using language 'more than' and 'fewer than'. They will be exploring language of direction and position. The children will talk about and explore 3D shapes (for example, cubes, cuboids, pyramids, cones and cylinders) using informal and mathematical language.









Understanding the World

RE using the 2022 Newham Agreed Syllabus

RE-related activities focus on three themes:

- celebrating special times
- aspects of identity and relationships
- stories and what they tell us

This half term we will be exploring 'How do people celebrate Easter?'



The children will have the opportunity to explore their environment both indoors and outdoors. They will be looking at our local environment, and further afield, around the world. They will look at how people travel around the world and look at how things move.









Expressive Arts & Design



Children will children will be exploring how to use their imagination to retell and make up their own stories.

Behaviour & Expectations

- Punctuality and attendance are crucial for both academic and social development.

- We expect pupils to make the most of their time in nursery- focus and attention are key (and we ensure the lessons are enjoyable and memorable).

Supporting Pupils at Home

- Speak to your child about the things they are doing at nursery.
- Share stories and make some of your own up too!
- Join your child in their play, build together, laugh together, sing and dance
- Cook together.
- Get your child to help you with preparing for meal times, counting cutlery or cups.
- Go for a walk and look for treasure (feathers, stones, puddles, grass, cats... anything that you love!)
- Talk about their emotions and how they are feeling at different times (happy, sad, angry, confused etc).









Behaviour

We promote the development of a sense of right and wrong by teaching your child the appropriate way to act and discouraging unacceptable behaviour. Sometimes it is necessary to help children understand their own boundaries in certain situations, explaining why we do not accept certain behaviours. We believe that all children have a right to feel valued, respected, and safe. For this to happen in practice, we have a responsibility to behave in ways that enable all of us to feel free to explore and learn without fear of being hindered or hurt.

Young children usually misbehave because they have not yet learnt how to react to feelings and needs in acceptable ways.
