Our PPA Day will usually be on Wednesday. This is when children will be taught a range of specialist subjects: geography/history, PE, art and design and Spanish.












The children will be writing their own narrative stories that have been inspired by reading the following texts:



## Supporting Pupils at Home

- Please ensure that your child reads every evening (aim for 20 minutes). You can help by discussing the meaning of key words and asking questions about the book that your child is reading.
- Ensure that an adult has signed the child's reading record each day. Encourage them to make a note of new words they have read or parts of their book they did or did not like.
- Encourage your children to read a range of reading material magazines, graphic novels, newspapers etc.
- Children also benefit from being read to.
