Summer Term 1

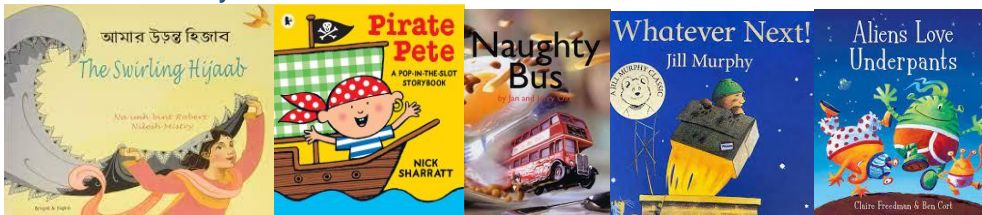


Dear Parents / Carers,

We hope you have all had a restful Easter break and thank you for your continued support. We are very much looking forward to an exciting summer term in Nursery. Remember to check Tapestry on a regular basis to see what your children are learning and to share your child's proud moments with us.

This half term, our topic is **Travelling and Explorers** with the key question - **How can we get to where we want to go?** During this topic the children will have opportunities to learn about different types of transport. We will be exploring trains, aeroplanes, cars, boats and buses and thinking about the different ways they move and how they work. The children will be going on many 'journeys' this half term using their imaginations to transport themselves into different worlds.

In Literacy the children will continue to develop their vocabulary through the use of our key texts:



Summer is a great time for outdoor activities. The Nursery children are encouraged to play outside the classroom as much as possible, not only to enjoy the sunshine, but to develop their gross motor skills, coordination, social skills such as sharing and taking turns. We plan on making the most of the spring weather and have a huge array of fun, topic-based activities for both indoors and outdoors. Please ensure that your child has a named sun hat in school to wear as the days start to get warmer, as well as applying sun cream prior to them coming to school to keep them safe in the sun. We will also be talking to the children about the importance of 'Sun Safety'.

As this is the final term for children in nursery before moving up to Reception, we would like to encourage the children to develop as much independence as possible. Independence is about learning to do things for themselves, which includes making decisions and taking on responsibility. These are hugely important skills for children to learn to cope with in adulthood.

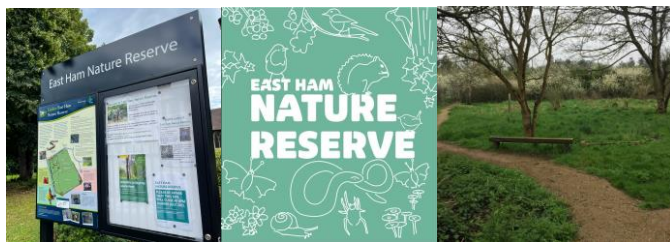
Dates for this term's educational Visits

Reading

Curriculum This term's topic: Travelling and Explorers – How can we get to where we want to go?

C&L- The children will continue practising their speaking and listening skills. They will use talk to organise themselves and their play. They will also be focusing on asking **why** questions.

PSED- This term we are planning for the children's transition into Reception. Encouraging the children to become more independent will be a priority for us. As part of the RSHE curriculum, we are following the Jigsaw Scheme. This term's topic is Relationships and we will be focusing on the book: *I Want a Friend* by Tony Ross.

PD- This half term we will be concentrating on activities which support the development of the children's fine motor skills. These activities will develop the muscles the children need to gain good pencil control, and therefore be able to form recognisable letters and numbers.

Literacy- The children will continue learning letters and sounds supported by the RWI programme. Segmenting and blending the sounds in words will also be a focus element during phonics sessions and continuous provision.

Maths- Our focus will be on number – children will continue counting forwards, and backwards accurately using the counting principles. They will learn to compare quantities using language 'more than' and 'fewer than'. They will be exploring language of direction and position.

UW- The children will have the opportunity to explore their environment both indoors and outdoors. They will be looking at our local environment, and further afield, around the world. They will look at how people travel around the world and look at how things move.

EAD- During the sessions, the children will be exploring how to use their imagination to retell and make up their own stories.
