**Building Personal Success** 

#### Dear Parents / Carers:

We are looking forward to starting the final term, where we work towards the children achieving their Early Learning Goals. During our first week back, we will be concentrating on re-establishing routines, positive learning behaviours, expectations and focusing on children's mental health and well-being.

Our whole school topic for this half term is *Travelling and Explorers*. The children in Reception will be learning about travelling and asking the question, 'Where can we go?'

We will be learning about the difference between types of vehicles and discussing how people travelled in the past. We will also explore different places in the world through a variety of stories, discussions and online clips. We will be using a number of key texts to support us in delivering our topic, such as *The Swirling Hijab, How to Catch a Star, Here Come the Aliens, Naughty Bus* and *Handa's Surprise.* 

As the weather changes this term, more of the children may find that they need to take off their jumper or cardigan when working outside. Therefore, we would like to encourage parents to label all of your child's clothing, particularly jumpers and cardigans, as this helps to return any lost items back to you. It would also be beneficial to provide your child with a sun hat and sunglasses to wear in the outside area. On very sunny days, please put sunscreen on your child before they come to school.

#### Home Learning:

Reading: The children will continue to take home story books and library books each week. We encourage families to read with their child every day and make a comment in their Reading Record once a week.

Your child also has access to Oxford Reading Buddy where they can access a variety of online story books. You can find their login details in the back of their Reading Record.

## **Curriculum**

## This term's topics: Travelling and Explorers - Where can we go?

**Literacy** – We will be acting out and retelling stories the children have read in their own words using props and small world figures. We will be continuing to read and understand simple sentences by using phonic knowledge to decode regular words and read them aloud accurately. The children will also be encouraged to write simple sentences independently, which can be read by themselves and others.

**Maths** – We will continue to deepen our understanding of number, by focusing on the following elements. *Cardinality & Counting:* Understanding that the cardinal value of a number refers to the quantity, or 'how many' of things it represents.

*Comparison:* Understanding that comparing numbers involves knowing which numbers are worth more or less than each other.

*Composition:* Understanding that one number can be made up from (composed from) two or more smaller numbers.

**Communication and Language –** We will be working on using our speaking and listening skills to follow instructions involving several ideas or actions. The children will also be encouraged to answer 'how' and 'why' questions about their experiences and in response to stories or events.

**Personal, Social, Emotional Development –** We will continue to develop sharing and caring skills and the children will be learning to negotiate turn taking and dealing with minor disagreements by themselves. They will be learning about how their behaviour impacts on others. The PSHE Jigsaw topic this half term is *World Relationships*. The children will learn about how to make friends and try to solve friendship problems when they occur. The PSHE book that will be used in the PSHE lessons this half-term is *George and Martha: The Complete Stories of Two Best Friends.* 

**Physical Development –** We will be continuing to refine the children's fine motor skills to develop the dexterity to form letters and numbers correctly and smaller in size.

**Expressive Arts and Design –** We will be participating in activities where the children can design their own transport using junk modelling. They will also explore making 3D models of planets and also create their own traffic and pirate maps.

**Understanding the World –** Linking with our topic, we will be exploring the world and learning about space. The children will also be learning about different countries around the world and how they differ from the UK. They will look at the different beliefs and practices that people follow.
