At the end of Year 2, the four classes will be mixed up, taking in to account friendships groups, attainment, attitudes to learning and also to give children new opportunities to learning alongside peers within their year groups. The children will be naming up to three friends that they would like to be in the same class as; their voice on this matter is very important to us.
