Home Learning and Reading Records

Therefore, it is expected that all children are reading every evening for 20-30 minutes and record this in their reading record. To ensure we work together to improve your child's reading success, we would like to ask you to monitor their daily reading closely and ensure they record their reading in their reading record. It is vital that you listen to your children read. Listening to your child read helps them with understanding and comprehension as well as working out what is printed on the page. Home Learning will also include Times Table RockStars and RWI spelling. For children who would like more home learning, we suggest your child carries out further research about their history topic: Looking at the impact of the Romans on Britain. If you are able to, visiting your local library and taking out books about The Romans to read with your child will greatly benefit their learning experience.

Y3 PE Days


PE days are:

In their PE lessons, the children will be playing rounders or cricket.

Appropriate clothing suitable for the weather should be worn. Your child will require a bottle of water.



Curriculum

This term's learning:

English: In English, the focus will be on sports and games, and non-fictional writing. Children will write the biography of a sports personality and writing the rules for a game.

<u>Maths</u>: Geometry- Pupils will explore angles using mathematical vocabulary and investigation. They then compare angles to one another and describe turns using both angles and fractions.

<u>Science</u>: Year 3 science will focus on plants and an in-depth study of flowers, fruits and seeds. The children will identify and name the different parts of a plant and what they do. Know what a plant needs to grow and be healthy. Investigate the way in which water is transported within plants. Understand the part that flowers play in the life cycle of flowering plants, including pollination, seed formation and seed dispersal.

<u>History</u>: What was it like when the Romans ruled Britain? is our focus this term. Within this topic, Year 3 will learn all about the Roman invasion, the battles with the Celts, the story of Queen Boudicca and how the Romans still impact our lives today

<u>Religious Education</u>: What do Sikhi sayings tell us about Sikhi beliefs? In this unit children will be investigating Sikh symbols and sayings, applying how Sikh and English sayings impact people's lives today and will link similar teachings from different religions.

<u>PSHE</u>: We will look at the topic of *Changing Me* as the children prepare to move into a new school year. The book *My New Baby* by Anne Kubler will be read to support their study of families.

Art and Design: Sculpture and 3D – Abstract and Shapes

Design and Technology: Structures – Building a castle

Computing: Programming B- Events and actions in programs

PE: Rounders and Cricket

Music: Project Earth Rock-Impact of aviation and rainforests - Playing the Ukulele

Spanish: Traditional Toys and Games
