<u>Curriculum</u>

This term's topics:

English:

We have linked our English topic with the Brampton curriculum topic *Follow The Rules*. The children will be looking at different sports and will be writing non-fiction texts. They will look at audience and purpose for texts and will be creating their own newspaper article based on Euro 2024.

<u>Maths</u>:

This term we will be revising the topics children struggled with this year. We will focus on fractions, area, perimeter, volume and reading graphs. Alongside this, the children will continue to develop their understanding of long multiplication and division as part of their learning in arithmetic.

Wider Curriculum:

This term we will be learning about the differences between the Spartans and Athenians in Ancient Greece. We will also be learning about some significant events from this period and will consider the lasting impact this civilisation has had on our world today.

Science:

This term in science, the children will be learning about some of the changes they will experience as they grow up. The children will explore reproduction in mammals and birds and compare it to the human life cycle.

Religious Education:

This term in RE, pupils will be exploring how Christians have tried to follow Jesus of Nazareth. The children will be given the opportunity to identify what their own priorities in life are and consider who they follow. We will consider what a Christian might learn from the stories about Jesus with a focus on what Jesus taught about giving. Alongside this, we will be summarising how Jesus set an example for Christians and the key principles underlying the way of life many people of this religion adopt.
